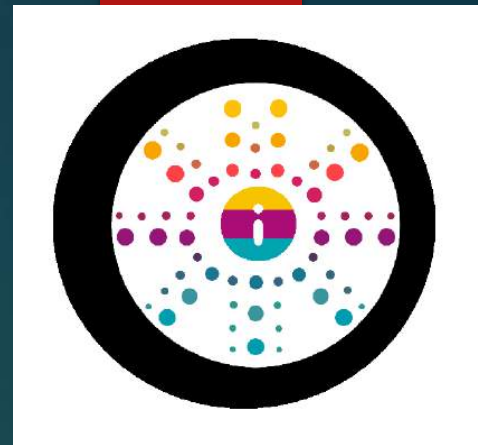

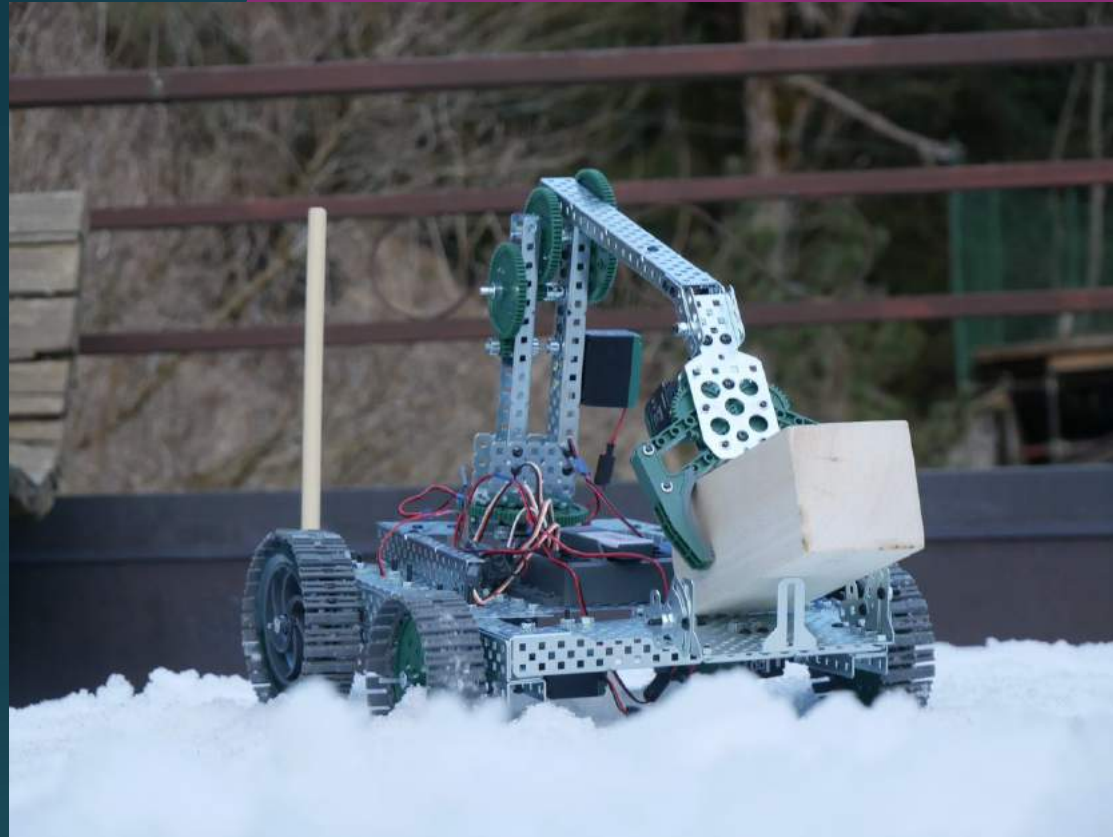
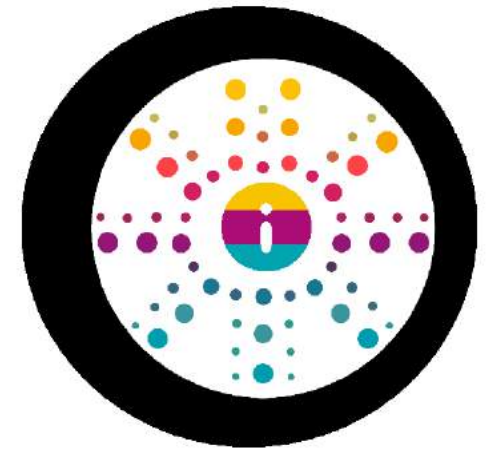

SKI TRIP 2020



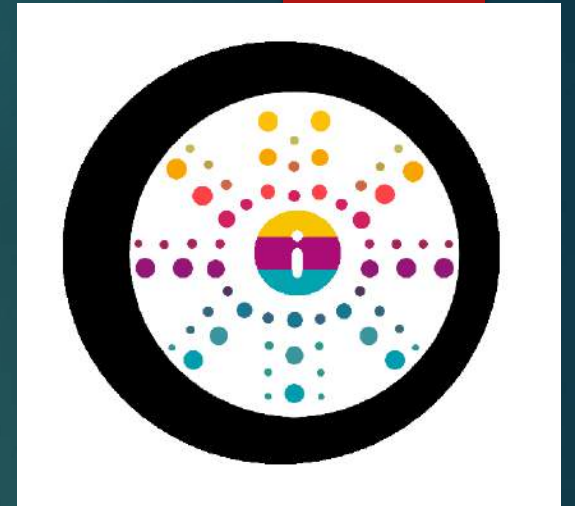

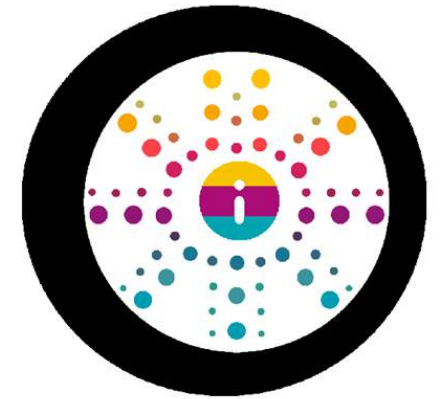
Other hobbies include boxing, running and football. He is a keen Manchester United supporter, as well as playing FIFA, where he usually plays as Bayern Munich.

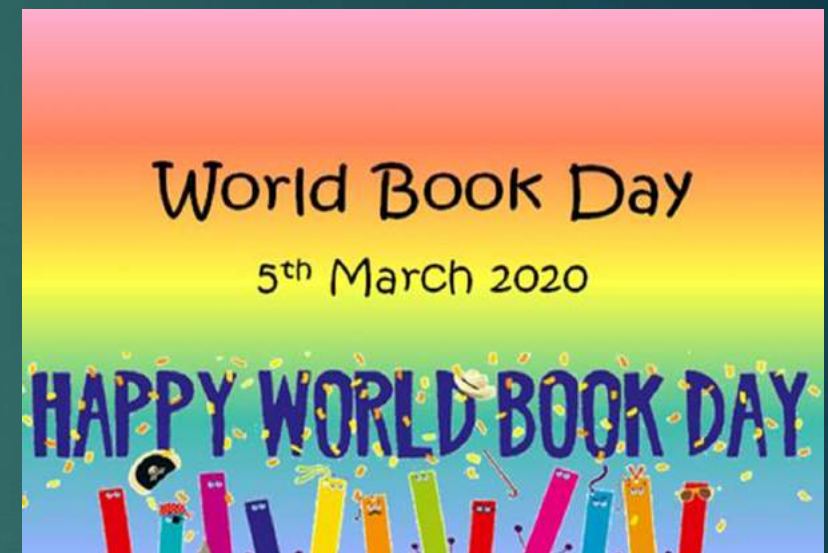

“Not all readers are leaders, but all leaders are readers.” - Harry Truman



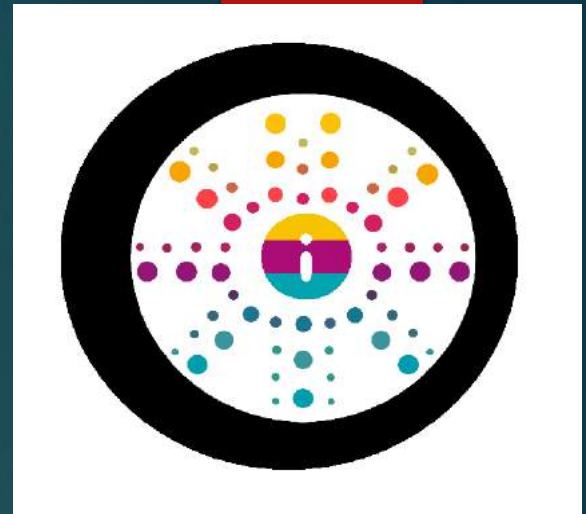

Edtech50

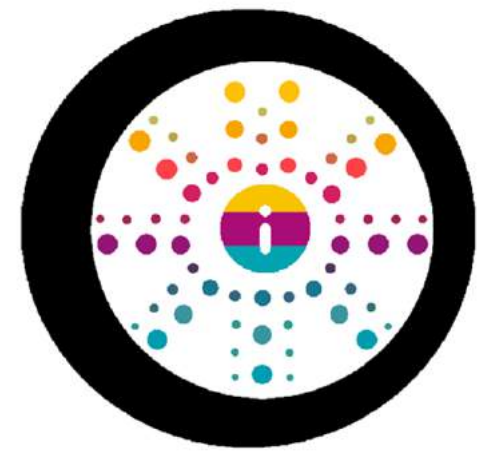
The Edtech 50 celebration took place at the Amazon building earlier this year and LDE UTC was there in force.

DUKE OF EDINBURGH'S AWARD



Rowan interviewed the Leader and expedition Manager – Jonny Morgan

“The duke of Edinburgh Award (also known as DofE) is a skill-based opportunity that requires anyone aged 14 and above to undertake three specific skills/challenges in order to gain access to the final part of the award - the expedition”.

We asked Jonny how long the club had been running, and how often:

“3.30pm every Thursday since the end of October, in Rooms 1.02 and 1.00.”



Jonny had previously led the DofE award in another school, so he saw this as an opportunity for learners to enhance their job applications, interviews and build character.
